This Assembly celebrates International Women's Day and welcomes the role that women in Wales and across the world play in their communities, in their families and in their workplace. The Assembly notes with particular pleasure its position as a leader amongst democratic political institutions in Europe for the representation of women and for its statutory responsibility to have due regard to equal opportunities in the way it exercises its functions and carries out its business.

This Assembly commits itself to work to remove the continuing inequalities that exist. It notes with particular concern the problems of low pay and the gap between women's and men's pay; the continuing low level of childcare and support for women as carers. It also notes the continuing level of violence against women and the double discrimination faced by ethnic minority women and disabled women.

The Assembly commits itself to work with the Wales Women's National Coalition, the Equal Opportunities Commission and other organisations to tackle these problems and to achieve

the aspirations contained in their National Agenda for Action, which arises for the UN Agenda for Women.
