We do not fund Llandudno Hoteliers Association (LHA) but representatives from the Association sit on the Board of NWT.

The Deputy Minister for Skills and Technology (Jeff Cuthbert): In April 2013 Jobs Growth Wales reached its first birthday and exceeded its target by creating 6,000 job opportunities for young people across Wales and getting 4,042 unemployed young people into work.

Already in this second year, as of 12th June 2013, 1,246 young people have entered a job opportunity through Jobs Growth Wales. So that's 5,288 young people who have entered a job opportunity so far.

With regards the destinations of these young people, early indications look very promising with a significant number of young people who complete their 6 month job opportunity sustaining employment and some progressing into an apprenticeship. As at 12th June, 78% of those young people have progressed into sustained employment (including apprenticeships). The data is based on the first 1083 young people completing the six month opportunity.

548 participants have left the programme prior to completion of the 6 month opportunity. This figure should be considered as a percentage of the total number of young people who have started on the programme to date. Of those individuals, 30% have progressed into sustained employment or an apprenticeship and 70% are unemployed.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Mark Drakeford): Together for Health - Cancer Delivery Plan for the NHS sets out the Welsh Government's commitment to encourage participation in national population screening programmes. In 2011/12 over 230,0001 women were screened for cervical cancer in Wales; the majority in response to a formal invitation from the screening programme.

There is no overall downward trend in cervical screening in Wales. Across the 25-64 year old age range 78.1% were screened in 2007/08 and 79.7% in 2011/12. For younger women (25-29 year olds) 71.1% were screened in 2007/08 and 76.5% in 2011/12. For older women (60-64 year olds) 75.4% were screened in 2007/08 and 75.1% in 2011/12.

Public Health Wales (PHW) delivers screening programmes at the Government's behest. PHW has a screening engagement team that works with under-represented groups to promote awareness across the range of screening programmes, this includes cervical screening. Activities include participation/ organisation of promotional events, information literature and more recently, the development of a Facebook page and YouTube channel.

Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) testing is not currently part of the cervical screening programme in Wales. There are three aspects to HPV screening: test of cure, triage and primary screening. The implications of how HPV screening could be introduced in Wales, taking consideration of the beneficial effects of the HPV immunisation programme is being explored. Options will be presented to the Wales Screening Committee for consideration in due course.
