

Sources of Information and financial assistance relating to the Arts

Introduction

This guide outlines and signposts information and sources of financial assistance relating to the Arts in Wales.

All Wales support

Arts Council of Wales

The Arts Council of Wales distributes funding from the Welsh Government and the National Lottery. It is responsible for funding and developing the arts in Wales.

Set out below are the categories of grant provided by the Arts Council of Wales.

Individuals

- Small Grants (between £250 and £5,000)
- Mainline Grants (between £5,001 and £20,000)
- Small Training grants (between £250 and £2,000)
- Creative Wales Awards (between £5,001 to £25,000)
- Creative Wales Ambassador Awards (£25,000)

Organisations

- Small Grants (between £250 and £5,000)
- Mainline Grants (between £5,001 and £30,000)
- up to £100,000 (for large scale National Touring and larger Festival projects)

Wales Arts International

Wales Arts International is a partnership between the Arts Council of Wales and the British Council, which provides advice and support to artists and arts organisations from Wales who work on an international level. They are also a contact point for international artists and arts organisations working in Wales.

Artists and arts organisations can apply to the **International Opportunities Fund** for up to £3,000 towards the costs of international activity, ranging from performing at a music festival overseas or exhibiting new work at a gallery, to developing new work with a theatre company or undertaking an artist's residency.

Arts Council of Wales Support

Individuals

Set out below is information on six funding schemes administered by the Arts Council of Wales, these schemes are aimed at individuals.

Small Project Grants (£250-£5,000)

The small project grant enables individuals to explore project ideas or to build their creative, artistic and professional capability over time.

If a project includes an element of production, applicants must have a partner organisation who will present their work in Wales.

Grants range from £250 to £5,000, however for research and development projects with no public presentation the maximum grant available is £3,000.

Small Training Grants (£250-£2,000)

Grants under this scheme range from £250 to £2,000 and aim to support individuals wishing to undertake or purchase training within Wales, the UK or abroad.

This grant also aims to support the provision of artistic, creative, technical, business and marketing training in the arts in Wales.

Mainline Production and Development Grants (£5,001-£20,000)

The grant aims to support artists in the creation of a new artistic product in collaboration with a partner organisation who will present their work in Wales.

Grants range from £5,001 to £20,000, however for research and development projects at this level; the maximum grant available is £6,000.

All applications for this grant must be accompanied by a high quality mentor's support and independent references.

The Creative Wales Awards

The Creative Wales Awards are designed to support artists' development at key career stages. Individuals may only receive one of the grants set out below every three years, measured from the date the project starts.

Creative Wales Awards (£5,001-£12,000)

These awards range from £5,001 to £12,000 and are available to enable artists, with an established track record in their art form, to develop their creative practice, enhance and refresh their skills, creativity and creative partnerships.

Major Creative Wales Awards (£20,000-£25,000)

These awards range between £20,000 and £25,000. For artists to be eligible for the Major Creative Wales Awards award, they must meet the requirements from the Creative Wales Awards. Artists should also be able to demonstrate a track record of achievement and contribution within their area of professional practice in Wales. All projects must include a strong element of experimentation with production or realisation in some form.

Creative Wales Ambassador Awards

The Creative Wales Ambassador Awards are an extension of the existing support structure for individuals. They are given to artists in Wales in recognition of excellence and best practice in their field. Individuals must be able to demonstrate the completion of a substantial body of work and an established reputation in their field. The ambassadorial aspect of the award will be delivered through the quality of the artist's work within an international context.

Organisations

Set out below is information on four grants schemes administered by the Arts Council of Wales. These schemes are aimed at organisations.

Small Grants (£250-£5,000)

This level of grant is for organisations planning and delivering projects that are pilots or that are generally not large scale or that have significant levels of funding from other sources.

Grants range from £250 to £5,000. First time applications will need to demonstrate the ability to manage public funds effectively.

Mainline Grants (£5,001-£30,000)

This level of grant is for organisations that have an established track record in arts development and project management. It is for larger programmes of work that create significant development in the arts sector.

Grants range from £5,001 to £30,000. The maximum grant available for regional or local projects is £30,000. For national or cross-regional projects, or for high priority projects within an Arts Council of Wales Regional Plan, applications of up to £50,000 may be considered. Applications of up to £100,000 may be considered for large scale National Touring projects and larger Festivals.

Training or Mentoring Grants (£1,000-£30,000)

These grants support provision of artistic, creative, technical, business, marketing and managerial training or mentoring in the arts in Wales, as well as board and organisational development.

Training or Mentoring Grants (£250-£5,000)

These grants support organisations wishing to undertake or purchase training or mentoring within Wales, the UK or abroad. These grants will also support board and organisational development. Organisations must have an appropriate training strategy for staff, board of management or volunteers, and a budget. Applications up to £10,000 may be considered if the project is for a more extensive programme of significant development in line with the Arts Council of Wales' priorities.

Literature Wales

Literature Wales (formerly Academi) is the National Company for the development of literature in Wales. Literature Wales includes Yr Academi Gymreig / The Welsh Academy - the society for writers in Wales, and Tŷ Newydd Writers' Centre.

Literature Wales can offer financial support to organisations towards the cost of literature events under the support scheme, Writers on Tour.

Eligible events include workshops, lectures, readings, conferences, events concerned with creative writing.

PRS for Music Foundation

The PRS for Music Foundation is the biggest funder of new music across all genres in the UK, with the aim of stimulating and supporting the creation of new music in the UK.

Set out below are some of the available grants from the PRS for Music foundation.

Awards for New Works

The Awards for New Works scheme supports those wishing to commission a new piece of music from UK-based music creators. Grants of up to £15,000 are available, with the average grant being around £3,000 - £4,000. Support is offered across the whole commissioning process and can include: fees to musicians; rehearsal costs; venue hire; and equipment hire.

Awards to Festivals

Grants of up to £3,000 are available to not for profit and charitable festivals in the UK with a commitment to programming new UK music of any genre. Eligible costs include running, travel, accommodation and administrative costs, equipment hire and other overheads.

Awards to Organisations

Grants of up to £3,000 are available to Not-for-profit organisations where new musical activity is their only, or main, activity. This scheme funds new music organisations in the UK to present a programme of new music activity over a period of up to one year. Eligible costs include running, travel, accommodation and administrative costs, as well as other overheads.

Awards to Performance Groups

Grants of up to £3,000 are available to performance groups in the UK regularly performing new UK music of any genre. Eligible costs include running and administrative costs as well as other costs incurred through performing.

Awards to Promoters

The Awards to Promoters scheme provides a contribution of up to £3,000 towards the overall annual budget of promoter's regularly programming live new music by UK-based music creators.

Grants of up to £5,000 are available towards the creation and performance of new music, across any genre, which is written by a woman creator living and working in the United Kingdom.

Community Groups and Clubs

The Millennium Stadium Charitable Trust

The Millennium Stadium Charitable Trust provides grants for voluntary organisations in Wales in support of sport, art, the community and the environment.

Funding is issued according to the geographical area that an organisation has a remit to cover. Three categories of organisation have been identified by the Trust:

- Local Organisations - Awards of up to £2,500 are available for organisations with a remit to serve their local community or town.
- Regional Organisations - Awards of up to £7,500 are available for organisations with a remit to cover a region or local authority-wide area of Wales.
- National Organisations - Awards of up to £12,500 are available for organisations with a remit to cover the whole of Wales and that are operating in the majority of counties in Wales.

Stiwdio Safle Programme

The Stiwdio Safle Programme seeks to develop artistic practice in areas previously under or unexplored by artists in Wales. It is designed to place artists in contact with communities in new environments and to build new creative and productive partnerships with organisations, artists and other professionals relevant to the environment in which the project is placed.

The upper limit for funding for any one project is £15,000 (other than in exceptional circumstances) and most projects would receive significantly less, capped at 50% of costs.

Clare Poetry and Literature Awards

The Clare Poetry and Literature Awards provides grant funding of between £1,000 and £10,000 for poetry and literature initiatives aimed at children and young people under the age of nineteen across the UK.

This scheme is open to registered charities, schools, professional or amateur arts companies, not for profit organisations and community groups. Total project costs must not exceed £20,000.

Foyle Foundation

Applicant organisations for the Small Grants Scheme must have an annual turnover of less than £100,000 and not be able to consistently generate operational surpluses or be able to build up unrestricted reserves to a level equivalent to three months' turnover.

Average grant ranges from £10,000 to £50,000.
