

Making Manifestos: Rosette template

Political parties use rosettes to show their identity and stand out during elections. The colours and designs help voters quickly recognise which party a candidate represents.

Use the sheets in this resource to make rosettes for your party.

Instructions


Print out the activity sheets you want to use.



There is a version which can be cut out and coloured as a single rosette.

There are also separate parts which can be printed out on either plain or coloured paper and stuck together to make the rosette.


To put the rosette together:

- Cut out the small circle (A) and stick it to the middle of the bigger circle (B).
- Stick this to the centre of the back piece (C) to make the main part of your rosette.
- Stick the tails (D) to the back of your rosette.







