1. Transport policy in Wales

Responsibility for roads and some aspects of road safety are devolved to Wales. The *Railways Act 2005* gave new powers to the Assembly in relation to the railways in Wales. The *Transport (Wales) Act 2006* gave Welsh Ministers new powers including a duty to develop and implement policies for the promotion of safe, integrated, economic and sustainable and services; alongside a duty to prepare a Wales Transport Strategy, setting out these policies. The Welsh Government is responsible for Trunk Roads and Motorways. Local authorities are responsible for other roads.

The Welsh Government currently has some limited powers over the provision of bus services in Wales. It operates a <u>concessionary fares scheme</u> for travel on buses and has provided financial support for long distance bus routes. It is also providing financial support for an air route between Cardiff and Anglesey.

Matters reserved to the UK Government include: ports and shipping; most aspects of civil aviation; some aspects of bus regulation; policing; national speed limits; road signs; vehicle construction and use regulations.

2. Recent developments

"Highways and Transport" is Field 10 of Schedule 5 of the <u>Government of Wales Act 2006</u>, which allows the National Assembly for Wales to seek Measure-making powers in this area. The <u>Local Transport Act 2008</u> has added a Matter to Schedule 5, giving the National Assembly for Wales legislative competence in relation to pricing schemes on the strategic road network.

The proposed <u>National Assembly for Wales (Legislative Competence)</u> (<u>Highways and Transport) Order 2009</u> originated as a SUSTRANS <u>petition</u> in 2008. The proposed Order would extend the legislative competence of the National Assembly for Wales to include the development and maintenance of networks of routes for pedestrians and cyclists. At present, the Enterprise and Learning Committee is to prepare and lay a Draft Order to be discussed in Plenary later this year.

The <u>Learner Travel (Wales) Measure 2008</u> makes provision regarding the travel of persons receiving primary, secondary or further education or training to and from their place of education, and received Royal Assent on 10 December 2008.
