CONTENTS

The Committee met on 9 December 2009. At the meeting the following Committee Members were present: Janet Ryder AM, Alun Davies AM, William Graham AM, Joyce Watson AM. Apologies were received from Mike German AM. There were no substitutions.

The Committee reports to the Assembly as follows:

Instruments in respect of which the Assembly is not invited to pay special attention under Standing Order 15.2

Instruments subject to annulment pursuant to a resolution of the Assembly (Negative Procedure)

SLC356 - The Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee (Wales) Regulations 2009

Negative Procedure. Date made 25 November 2009. Date laid 26 November 2009. Coming into force date 17 December 2009

The Committee noted that Regulation 3.-(1) specified that the members of the joint committee consisted of the chief executives of each local health board (LHBs) together with a number of others.

The Committee further noted that in the Explanatory Memorandum (EM) to the Regulations one of the consultation responses was: "Each LHB Chief Executive to have a designated deputy". The EM goes on to say that this will "be addressed in a Memorandum between the LHB Chief Executives and in the Joint Committee's Standing Orders..."

Given what appeared to be the prescriptive membership arrangements in relation to LHB chief executives set out in Regulation 3(1), the Committee was unclear how the proposed Memorandum would be able to allow deputies to attend.

The Committee agreed not to invite the Assembly pay special attention to the regulations under Standing Order 15.2 but to write to the Minister asking for further clarification of this matter.

SLC357 - The Materials and Articles in Contact with Food (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2009

Negative Procedure. Date made 26 November 2009. Date laid 27 November 2009. Coming into force date 19 December 2009

The Committee noted that the Explanatory Memorandum stated (para 6.1) that "The Agency has not produced a Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA) as the proposed legislation imposes no significant impact on Wales." This was, however, contradicted in the Explanatory Note to the Regulations which said (para 3) that "A regulatory impact assessment has been prepared as to the likely costs and benefits of complying with these Regulations. A copy can be obtained from the Food Standards Agency, 11th Floor, Southgate House, Wood Street, Cardiff CF10 1EW."

The Committee agreed not to invite the Assembly pay special attention to the regulations under Standing Order 15.2 but to write to the Minister for clarification of this matter.

SLC359 - The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Wales) (Amendment) (No.2) Regulations 2009

Negative Procedure. Date made 30 November 2009. Date laid 2 December 2009. Coming into force date 1 January 2010

SLC360 - The Non-Domestic Rating Contributions (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2009

Negative Procedure. Date made 30 November 2009. Date laid 2 December 2009. Coming into force date 31 December 2009

SLC361 - The Staffing of Maintained Schools (Wales) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2009

Negative Procedure. Date made 2 December 2009. Date laid 4 December 2009. Coming into force date 1 January 2009

Other Business

Flood and Water Management Bill

In accordance with its remit under Standing Order 15.6 (ii) (i.e., the Committee may consider and report on "the appropriateness of provisions in Bills for Acts of the United Kingdom Parliament that grant powers to make subordinate legislation to the Welsh Ministers").

The Committee considered the Flood and Water Management Bill, which was introduced in the House of Commons 19 November 2009 and decided to write to the Minister for Environment, Sustainability and Housing of the Welsh Assembly Government Jane Davidson AM to ask for briefing on the Bill and to invite her to give oral evidence to the Committee in the New Year.

Committee Correspondence

The Committee discussed the Minister for Environment, Sustainability and Housing Jane Davidson AM's response to the Chair's letter regarding SLC346 - The Hazardous Waste (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2009.

The Committee accepted the Minister's reason for a six months period during which the Regulations drafted for England were used as default legislation for Wales. The Committee agreed that the role of Government Agencies in the making of subordinate legislation is an issue that may need further exploration as part of the Committee's Inquiry on Statutory Instruments.

Subordinate Legislation Committee Report

Title: The Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment and Support Schemes (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2009
