Request for Information.

Thank you for your request received 7 April in which you asked:

What was the cost to recall Welsh AM's to debate Tata steel and the sale of the site in Wales?

The recall of the National Assembly for Wales on Monday 4 April 2016, coincided with some maintenance works, planned for the Assembly recess. Consequently, these works were accelerated to completion at a cost of £2,343.05, which comprised additional staff labour and overtime.

Any expenses incurred and claimed by Assembly Members, including those relating to travel costs and overnight claims, are published on the Allowance Publication System (available here:

http://www.assemblywales.org/memhome/pay-expenses-financial-interestsstandards/mem-expenses-2.htm).

These can be broken down by Assembly Member and/or the month or year the expense was incurred, and the results can be further filtered against allowance or expenses type. Claims for expenses are required to be submitted within three months of incurring them and such claims are automatically published on the last working Friday of each month, three months in arrears. Any claims relating to the plenary meeting on 4 April 2016 will be published at the end of July 2016.
