

# Motions and Amendments for Debate on 17 October 2006

## Motions tabled on 10 October 2006

### Minority Party Debate

#### **NDM3249 Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales:

1. Calls on the Assembly Government to develop and present for consultation by the end of the year a wide-ranging "Quality of Food" strategy to improve the quality of food consumed in Wales. Such a strategy should embrace:

- a) Making Food Studies part of the National Curriculum, teaching children about nutrition as well how to cook healthy food;
- b) Improving the nutritional standard of school meals and meals provided in hospitals;
- c) Healthy eating schemes aimed at areas of social deprivation;
- d) Reducing the levels of pesticides and toxins in food and
- e) Further encouraging the production and consumption of organic food.

#### **NDM3248 Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)**

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales resolves:

1. Calls on the Assembly Government to publish an annual report on educational progress of looked-after children, which will be presented to the proposed cross-cutting children's services scrutiny committee.

## **4. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Assembly Government to set minimum fostering allowance rates that reflect the real costs of caring for a child.

## **Amendments tabled on 12 October 2006**

To propose that the Assembly resolves to adopt the following amendments to motions:

### **NDM3249**

Add new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to ensure a reduction in food miles by developing local supplier networks.

#### **2. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to carry out an immediate survey of all schools to assess the implications of providing adequate time and space for all pupils to sit down and eat a meal.

Increasing local procurement and working to reduce food miles.

#### **4. Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)**

In paragraph 1, delete: "by the end of the year" and replace with "by the end of the second Assembly".

#### **1. Lisa Francis (Mid and West Wales)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Requires robust action to transform a system of care in which at present most young people are destined to end up without qualifications, unemployed, homeless or in prison.

#### **2. Lisa Francis (Mid and West Wales)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Requires the Welsh Assembly Government to keep the cost of Local Safeguarding Children Boards in Wales under review to ensure that no unfunded burdens are imposed on local authorities or an equivalent, and believes it would be unacceptable for any serious incident to occur simply because the Boards were not sufficiently well funded.

### **3. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Believes that the Children's Commissioner for Wales would be more effectively able to safeguard the needs of children in Wales if they were able to make representations on both devolved and non devolved issues; and to both Assembly and Westminster governments.

### **4. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to produce annual updates on the implementation of recommendations made in the various recent child protection reports in Wales.

### **5. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Add new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to put in place a mechanism to ensure that all public authorities and the voluntary sector conduct Criminal Records Bureau checks on all staff working with children.

Add new point at end of motion:

Calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to promote working in partnership and an integrated approach towards vulnerable children and ensure fast and effective services.
