Forestry Commission Wales (FCW) led on this work along with welsh government officials, the Countryside Council for Wales (CCW), Environment Agency Wales, Wales Environment Link, National Park Authorities CADW, the Archaeological Trusts and Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty officers.

In early 2012, following representations from stakeholders, revisions were made to the maps. This involved changing around 300,000 hectares of land from the 'red' category into the 'amber' category.

The revised Opportunities Maps were launched at the Royal Welsh Show in 2012 and are available on the FCW Map Viewer on the FCW website at: http://www.forestry.gov.uk/forestry/INFD-8A9FPS

A working group including Welsh Government and FC/National Resources Wales officials and stakeholder representatives is working on the development of the forestry aspects of the new RDP.

Alun Davies: The announcement of the plan to create an additional 100,000 hectares of woodland in Wales was made in 2010.

The amount of woodland creation since that date is:-

2010/11 298 hectares (Source: Forestry Statistics)
2011/12 750 hectares (Source: Forestry Statistics)
2012/13 545 hectares (Source: Interim figure from Forestry Commission Walds)

2012/13 545 hectares (Source: Interim figure from Forestry Commission Wales because the current planting season is still ongoing for 2012/13)

Total since 2010 = 1593 hectares.

My role as the Minister for Natural Resources and Food includes responsibility for the development of forestry policy as well as the key mechanisms for its delivery such as the Glastir Woodland Creation scheme and the work of Natural Resources Wales. I intend to ensure that there are clear and measurable outcomes for the delivery of this target as well as the many others defined in our Woodland Strategy for Wales.

The Minister for Communities and Tackling Poverty (Huw Lewis): 'Travelling to a Better Future – A Gypsy and Traveller Framework for Action and Delivery Plan' was launched in September 2011 and included several commitments which will improve access to public services in Wales. These include improving attendance rates at schools for Gypsy and Traveller young people, working with schools to ensure the curriculum reflects Gypsy and Traveller culture and history, improving the health outcomes of the Gypsy and Traveller community in Wales, and raising awareness of the health needs of the community. I will be providing an update against all the objectives outlined in Travelling to a Better Future in October 2013.

Objective 6 of the Welsh Government's Strategic Equality Plan makes a clear commitment to putting the needs of service users at the heart of delivery in key public services. This includes the Gypsy and Traveller community in Wales.

The Deputy Minister for Social Services (Gwenda Thomas): Direct payments give users of social services more choice and direct control over arrangements to meet their assessed needs for care and support, and assist them to live more independently. However, we know that only a small proportion of users are currently receiving them.

The latest data shows that the number of adults receiving direct payments in Wales continues to show a steady though modest increase of around 500 additional people a year.

We will use the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Bill to promote and extend direct payments, offering greater support to those who wish to use them, and enabling people to make informed choices about how their care and support is arranged. Direct payments will be an important element in our evolving model of citizen-directed support.

We will consider evidence and any lessons we can learn from the other UK nations as we develop our Regulations and Code of Practice on direct payments under the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Bill. Our Direct Payments Overview Group that has a range of relevant stakeholders in its membership have agreed to help us undertake this work.

Mark Drakeford: The Welsh Health Survey provides information on health and health-related lifestyle, and the main focus is on core topics useful to a wide range of users.

These include illnesses and other conditions, general health and well-being, smoking, alcohol, fruit and vegetable consumption, physical activity, body mass index, and the use of selected health services. I will consider this issue next time the survey is reviewed, alongside others that emerge, but inevitably additional topics of interest cannot always be accommodated.
