The Minister for Education and Skills (Leighton Andrews): In drawing up the current Welsh in Education Strategic Plans, all local authorities were requested to consider how they adopt systematic processes for measuring the demand for Welsh-medium education provision.

Officials have analysed this information and found that by April 2011, nine local authorities had conducted a specific survey in line with the former Welsh Language Board guidelines; six local authorities had included questions about Welsh-medium education as part of a generic questionnaire and seven local authorities had not conducted any such survey.

According to their intentions set out in their WESPs, the number of local authorities measuring demand will increase, although the methods will vary:

- four authorities say that they will conduct annual surveys from 2012 onwards;
- two say they will undertake surveys in 2012-13;
- one local authority aims to conduct a survey in 2013-14;
- four will gather and collate information in a systematic manner within their on-going forecasting
 of the provision of school places which pays specific attention to measuring the need for Welshmedium school places;
- three will conduct specific surveys of parental demand in more localised surveys,
- three will carry on with their general school place forecasting processes; and
- five have not committed themselves to conducting such surveys because of local Welsh-language education policies.

The range of practices have, therefore, been analysed and will inform the guidance if the Schools Standards and Organisation Bill is passed by the National Assembly for Wales.

Leighton Andrews: All local authorities were asked to prepare and submit a Welsh in Education Strategic Plan for implementation during 2012-13. As part of this request, they were asked to address the following questions:

- How do they measure the demand for Welsh-medium education?
- When and how was the last parental survey held?
- How have they used the results?
- How have they responded to the demand?
- How will the results affect their future plans for provision of school places?

All local authorities were provided with feedback on their WESPs before the end of March 2012. Subsequently, meetings have been arranged and conducted with officials from each local authority to discuss this feedback.

Local authorities who have not conducted surveys were made aware of the good practice undertaken and the need to conduct systematic surveys. All local authorities were asked to consider the link between Childcare Sufficiency Assessments and measuring the demand.

Local authorities have also been alerted to the provision proposed in the Schools Standards and Organisation Bill which if adopted may require local authorities to measure the demand for Welshmedium education under certain circumstances and using particular methods.

Leighton Andrews: Torfaen County Borough Council, in common with all other local authorities, were asked to prepare and submit a Welsh in Education Strategic Plan by 15 December 2011. This plan was then assessed by officials and feedback provided to the local authority by end of March 2012. Officials held a meeting with the Director of Education and the Welsh Adviser on 30 July 2012.

Torfaen had developed its Welsh in Education Strategic Plan in conjunction with the other local authorities in the former Gwent area, Newport, Blaenau Gwent and Monmouthshire. The Plan addresses specific issues relating to the provision of and support for Welsh-medium education in Torfaen as well as issues relating to support for Welsh-medium education across the region.

Between 2009 and 2011 the number of pupils assessed in Welsh at the age of 7 rose from 8.4% to 9.4%. A new Welsh-medium primary school was opened in 2010. The aim is to ensure that every parent wanting Welsh-medium education for their child secures a place within reasonable travelling distance. It is therefore appropriate that the County conducts an annual survey to measure the demand for Welsh-

medium education. The outcomes of the most recent survey, which combines measuring the demand for Welsh-medium education amongst parents and the Childcare Sufficiency Assessment, will be available later this year. There is also a recognition that additional secondary Welsh-medium provision will need to be provided.

John Griffiths: The level of housing provision set out in a Local Development Plan (LDP) includes sites with a valid planning permission, assumptions on small sites and windfalls expected over the plan period, as well as allocations to meet future needs. The Local Development Plan Manual identifies the supply of housing land, including sites with planning permission, as a key part of the evidence base local planning authorities should take into account when preparing their LDP. Planning Policy Wales reinforces the importance of identifying the location and quantity of sites with planning permission as all LDPs have to demonstrate they have a 5 year supply of housing land, with detailed guidance set out in Technical Advice Note 1 'Joint Housing Land Availability Studies'. Planning policy is therefore clear as to the significance and importance of taking sites with planning permission into account when preparing a LDP.

Assembly Commissioner (Peter Black): The 5th floor of Tŷ Hywel is sub-let to the Welsh Government. Whilst the Assembly Commission is responsible for planned and reactive maintenance for the building as a whole to include building fabric, plant, systems and equipment, the Welsh Government is responsible for arranging and funding any internal office refurbishments or upgrades required on the fifth floor. We do not hold maintenance costs for each floor of Tŷ Hywel. Many aspects of maintenance will be for the building as a whole, for example the cost of maintaining the building plant and systems such as heating, cooling, ventilation, lifts, lighting, power and so forth. However, as part of a phased programme of upgrading and replacing the office lighting system in Tŷ Hywel to a more sustainable lighting system to include sensor controlled lights with adjustable light levels and which automatically turn off when the

office is unoccupied, the Assembly Commission installed PIR controlled lights on the 5th floor in March 2012 at a cost of £38,499.
