Children and Young People Committee

The National Assembly for Wales' Children and Young People Committee is calling for evidence for its short inquiry into the Welsh Assembly Government's Parenting Action Plan.

The Parenting Action Plan was published in December 2005. The Plan sought to ensure that parents (mothers, fathers and carers) in Wales got the advice and support they need, by setting out what the Welsh Assembly Government intended to do for parents up to March 2008. The terms of reference for this inquiry are to:

- 1. Scrutinise the delivery of the Parenting Action Plan (Dec 2005-March 2008);
- 2. Scrutinise what the Welsh Assembly Government is doing to continue, and develop, its work on parenting and the resources available to do so;
- 3. Take evidence on what works and what doesn't and on what action needs be taken to move the agenda forward.

Invitation to contribute to the inquiry

Interested parties are invited to submit written evidence to the Clerk of the Committee at the above address, to arrive no later than Friday 20 June 2008.

If possible, please supply an electronic version in MS Word or Rich Text format, either by e mail to <u>equality.comm@wales.gsi.gov.uk</u> or on a disk.

Please begin your submission by providing some information about your organisation before setting out your views and experiences in relation to some or all of the following areas.

1. Delivery of the Parenting Action Plan

- How effective do you consider the implementation of the Parenting Action Plan to have been?
- Has the amount of support available to parents increased?
- Is support accessible for all parents?
- Is support getting through to the parents who need it most?
- Do parents receive more information, and is positive parenting effectively promoted?
- Do parents participate more in planning services and in schools?
- Are you aware of barriers experienced by parents in accessing support services and information sources? What are the key reasons for these barriers?
- Can you provide any examples of innovative practice in ensuring that services and information is accessible, and barriers can be overcome?

2. Continued work on parenting

• What do you consider to be the key parenting issues still needing to be addressed by the Welsh Assembly Government?

3. What has worked, and what hasn't?

- Are you aware of any examples of good practice in supporting parents? Can you detail these, and explain why these examples have been successful?
- Can you identify any areas of the Parenting Action Plan which you consider to have been successfully implemented, and any that have not? Why have these areas been successfully implemented, or not?

The Committee has invited submissions from those on the attached distribution list. However, we would be grateful if you could forward a copy of the letter to any individuals or organisations that are not included but might like to contribute to the review. A copy of this letter has been placed on the National Assembly's web-site with an open invitation to submit views.

Disclosure of Information

Witnesses should be aware that once written evidence has been submitted to the Committee it is treated as the property of the Committee. It is the Committee's intention to place written papers on its website, and may subsequently be printed with the report. The National Assembly will not publish information which it considers to be personal data.

In the event of a request for information submitted under UK legislation, it may be necessary to disclose the information that you provide. This may include information which has previously been removed by the National Assembly for publication purposes.

If you are providing any information, other than personal data, which you feel is not suitable for public disclosure, it is up to you to stipulate which parts should not be published, and to provide a reasoned argument to support this. The National Assembly will take this into account when publishing information or responding to requests for information.
