## **Amendments tabled on 18 March 2004**

To propose that the Assembly resolves to adopt the following amendments to motions:

### **NDM1875**

#### **1. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

At the end of point 2 delete 'and' and replace with:

'but acknowledges that the Assembly Government is limited by the current devolution settlement to make an impact on poverty in Wales.'

#### **2. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new after point 2 and renumber accordingly:

Notes that the Social Justice Agenda in Wales is also being hindered by the failure of the UK Labour Government to make any substantial progress in this issue despite its commitment to end child poverty in a generation. And further notes that its plans to introduce new indicators to measure child poverty will not truly remove children from poverty but simply remove them from the statistics by changing the definition of poverty.'

### **3. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Subject to the outcome of the Commission's investigation of the Voluntary Sector Partnership Scheme, calls on the Assembly Government to review the classification and funding of core services provided by the voluntary sector.'

### **4. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Believes it unacceptable that a significant proportion of children in Wales still live in households without the following essentials: a fridge, a washing machine, central heating, a weather-proof coat for each child, toys and one weeks holiday away from home each year.'

### **5. Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)**

Delete point 3 in its entirety and replace with:

'Acknowledges the progress towards achieving Social Justice objectives in Wales.'

### **6. Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Accepts that the achievement of Social Justice objectives requires a full and proper engagement with the Independent Sector on all levels within investment and service provision.'

### **7. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Delete point 3 and replace with:

'Believes that the Post Office Urban Network Reinvention Programme, itself a direct response to policies pursued by the UK Labour government, has a detrimental effect on social justice in Wales.'

## **8. Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire)**

Delete point 2 and replace with:

'Regrets that the report fails to methodically assess and measure targets to ensure the robust monitoring of progress.'

### **NDM1876**

#### **1. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

Recognises that the inequities that remain within the leasehold system cannot be addressed within the confines of the current constitutional arrangement.

#### **2. Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Regrets the change from residence to ownership for qualification to purchase the Freehold Reversion.'

#### **3. Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)**

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Regrets the failure to introduce a new method of valuation in respect of the calculation of the Freehold Reversion of a block of flats.'

#### **Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)**

Add at end of motion:

', but agrees that this should be subject to meeting all competencies required of teaching staff in Wales'.

Notes that the cost of any referendum will fall on Council Tax payers and that requires that information about costs be laid in all public libraries in the area.
