# 52<sup>nd</sup> BIMR Conference (hosted by CPA UK) Westminster April 2023

This year's Regional Conference was held in the UK Parliament and was attended by the Chair as well as by the Branch Vice-President David Rees MS, Rhianon Passmore MS and Joyce Watson MS. The conference covered several themes on which our Region had been focussed on in recent years, including the importance of diverse and inclusive parliaments, standards of behaviours as well as the Climate Emergency.

#### 66<sup>th</sup> Commonwealth Parliamentary Conference (CPC) Accra, Ghana October 2022

Adam Price MS and Carolyn Thomas MS represented the Senedd at this year's flagship CPA conference, attended by over 500 Commonwealth Parliamentarians. Plenary and workshop sessions included discussions on numerous issues, including LGBTQ+ Rights and Gender Equality within the wider context of the Conference theme "The Commonwealth Charter 10 years on: Values and Principles for Parliaments to Uphold". #### 2. Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians (CWP)

Whilst there has, disappointingly, not been a formal Regional Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians conference during this reporting period, Senedd Members have participate in a number of CWP Steering Committee meetings as well as other related activities.

Notably, Rhianon Passmore MS was re-elected as Vice Chair of the BIMR CWP and was selected to represent our BIMR Region at the <u>Women</u> <u>Political Leaders Summit in Brussels</u> (June 2023) as well as at the <u>Reykjavik Global Forum -Women Leaders</u> (November 2023)

Women Members of the Senedd's Branch Executive Committee have also played an active role in the <u>Senedd Women's Caucus</u> which was launched in June of this year. In November 2023, Delyth Jewell MS, Carolyn Thomas MS and Joyce Watson MS participated in a joint session with a visiting delegation from the Canadian Parliament to discuss and exchange best practice, as well as personal experiences on "Women in Parliament".

#### 3. <u>Commonwealth Parliamentarians with Disabilities (CPwD)</u>

Mark Isherwood MS has continued to play an active role in the CPwD network. A recent webinar, the latest in a series of Disability related presentations, included a presentation on <u>SEE Around Britain</u> – a project to support accessibility for people with disabilities had been

suggested by Mark Isherwood who also discussed the work of <u>Learning</u> <u>Disability Wales</u>.

## 4. Notable visits and other activities.

Visit by CPA Secretary General, Stephen Twigg (June 2023).

The Senedd Branch was pleased to have facilitated a comprehensive programme for the Secretary General's visit to the Senedd. This included meetings with Office Holders and Branch Secretariat and also with Huw Irranca-Davies MS and Mark Isherwood MS. A Branch hosted lunch provided the opportunity to discuss a range of issues from LGBT Rights, Parliamentarians with Disabilities and the CPA's legal status.

# <u>CPA webinar on SDGs: Beyond 2030</u> (August 2023) (Participation by Huw Irranca-Davies MS)

Huw Irranca-Davies MS was one of five panellists, representing a range of Commonwealth Parliaments, who contributed to this webinar.

The webinar explored a roadmap to forecast sustainable development post-2030, looking at the positives and negatives of the current SDGs and identified important lessons learned to overcome future risks and exploit future opportunities.

# BIMR Working Group on "Climate Emergency"

This Working Group has held several sessions over this reporting period. These have included a webinar hosted by Westminster on the topic of "*Equinor and the Norway story*" and "*The Ocean - Our Climate Ally*" led by the Isle of Man, which examined "blue carbon' ecosystems".

The Senedd CPA Branch will look to enhance opportunities for more Members to participate in the programme of this Working Group, in going forward.
