Dear Jenny Rathbone MS,

Thank you for your question following my Oral Statement on Electoral Reform made in Plenary on 16 May.

You asked that I share data on which local authorities accepted Welsh Government funding to improve electoral registration. This information can be found attached at Annex A.

We can say with certainty that all local authorities that appointed a Welsh Government-funded Electoral Registration Support Officer (ERSO) increased registration among newly enfranchised groups. Data detailed in Annex A supports our stance, with each local authority who was a recipient of grant funding and employed an ERSO reporting an increase in registered newly enfranchised voters.

It should be noted that local authorities who did not employ an ERSO mentioned either problems with recruitment, leaving them unable to employ, or not having the internal capacity to run a recruitment drive for this post as reasons why one was not in place. Some of those local authorities that did not appoint an ERSO also increased registration, although to a lesser extent. Local authorities that appointed an ERSO were very positive about the impact of the increased capacity, with many citing increased ability to engage face to face with target groups at schools or in community groups.

Those Local Authorities who did not receive funding for an ERSO were under no obligation to share data with us, this is reflected with Denbighshire and Newport not submitting data.

I hope this information is of use to you and I look forward to working with you towards our common goal of increasing democratic participation in Wales.
