Thank you for your request received 11 February in which you asked:

We are looking to find out the current levels of interest and engagement, if any, between the Welsh Assembly and the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea (DPRK). We would therefore like information on the following for the current Assembly:

- 1. Any statements and debates that have occurred either in the Assembly or in Committees relating to North Korea, in particular, conversations relating to the Human Rights situation in North Korea
- 2. The names of AMs that have been involved in the aforementioned debates and statements
- 3. Whether or not any AMs or Welsh Ministers have been involved in official visits or delegations to North Korea
- 4. If yes, the dates of the visit and the names of the AMs and Ministers involved
- 5. Whether or not any officials from the DPRK, or the DPRK's embassy in London, have visited the Welsh Assembly If yes, the dates of the visit, and whether or not he spoke to the Assembly or to a Committee.
- Any statements and debates that have occurred either in the Assembly or in Committees relating to North Korea, in particular, conversations relating to the Human Rights situation in North Korea.

Having searched our <u>Record of proceedings</u> and <u>Committee transcripts</u> we hold no recorded information that relates to your request.
