Motions tabled on 13 September 2005

NDM2555 Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales:

Considers the principle of the Housing Renewal Grants (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005 a copy of which was laid in Table Office on 28 June 2005.

NDM2556 Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales:

1. Considers the report of the Legislation Committee laid in the Table Office

on 12 July 2005 in relation to the draft Housing Renewal Grants (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005, and

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales, acting under section 62 (1) (b) of the Government of Wales Act 1998, resolves to delegate all functions of the National Assembly contained in or under The Human Tissue Act 2004, to the Assembly First Minister, save those which by law cannot be so delegated and those which require the consent of the Assembly to the making of regulations under sections 14(4) and 16(5) in so far as they relate to museums in Wales.

Nothing in this motion will have the effect of reducing the pre-eminence of the authority of the full Assembly or of reducing the role of the Assembly Committees in the exercise of the above functions.

This delegation will be made in the knowledge that those functions delegated to the First Minister will, as appropriate, be further delegated to the appropriate Assembly Minister and to staff.
