NDM3363 Christine Gwyther (Carmarthen West and South Pembrokeshire): Act FAST
– Stroke is a medical emergency

NDM3359 Jane Hutt (Vale of Glamorgan)

To propose that the National Assembly resolves:

1. That a Committee, to be known as Planning Decision Committee (2) 2007-1, be established in accordance with Standing Order 17 of the Assembly to discharge those functions of the Assembly in respect of the matters identified in the Schedule to this motion which are indicated in respect of each matter in that schedule and that the Assembly's functions in those respects be delegated to that Committee.
