Questions to the Deputy First Minister and Minister for the Economy and Transport

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): How many jobs have so far been created since the announcement of the £45m Business Growth Project at the third economic summit in December 2008? (WAQ53961)

The Deputy First Minister and Minister for the Economy and Transport (Ieuan Wyn Jones): The Business Growth Project announced at the economic summit in December, as part of a wider package of support available to SMEs in Wales, collects outputs against jobs created at completion of support. It is therefore too early in the process to have recorded any jobs created.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): What steps has the Welsh Assembly Government taken to ensure security at Llanbedr Airfield, Gwynedd, since it took over ownership of the site? (WAQ53963)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): What risk assessments has the Welsh Assembly Government carried out in relation to security risks regarding buildings and land on the area known as Llanbedr Airfield in Gwynedd since it came into its ownership? (WAQ53964)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Has the Welsh Assembly Government ever sought advice (or received advice) from any UKTI Defence and Security organisations regarding security at the disused Llanbedr Airfield in Gwynedd since it came into its ownership? (WAQ53965)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Does the Welsh Assembly Government employ any security company to undertake security at the disused Llanbedr Airfield in Gwynedd and, if so, what duties does this company undertake? (WAQ53966)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Are the Welsh Assembly Government's security arrangements for the Llanbedr Airfield site in Gwynedd in line with its insurer's requirements for the site? (WAQ53967)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): How does the Welsh Assembly Government monitor the security risk and liability issues at the Llanbedr Airfield site in Gwynedd? (WAQ53970)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Does the Welsh Assembly Government keep a Security Risk Register for the Llanbedr Airfield site in Gwynedd? (WAQ53971)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): What security arrangements are in place to prevent unwanted visitors entering the Llanbedr Airfield site in Gwynedd? (WAQ53972)

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Has the Welsh Assembly Government undertaken any terrorist risk assessment to the security of Llanbedr Airfield site in Gwynedd since it came into its ownership? (WAQ53973)

The Deputy First Minister: The Llanbedr Airfield site is currently vacant. However all buildings are secured and the site can only be accessed through locked gates. A two metre high security fence runs along the site perimeter that adjoins the highway, and regular site inspections are undertaken to ensure that there has been no illegal entry or breaches of security.

A thorough risk assessment of the site has been undertaken, and this has not deemed the site to be a security risk or at risk from domestic and/or international terrorism. As such no advice has been sought from any UK defence or security organisation.

In line with other government organisations, the Welsh Assembly Government does not insure vacant property.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Will the Minister make a statement on the Welsh Assembly Government's contact with 'Business in Focus' to provide advice and support for businesses in Powys? (WAQ53975)

The Deputy First Minister: Business in Focus was successful in winning a contract to deliver the Flexible Support for Business Regional Centre Service in Mid Wales, which includes Powys.

The tender document indicated that TUPE may apply to this contract; it was the responsibility of the potential contractors to ascertain the potential risk. Business in Focus entered into a dispute with one of the previous Business Eye contractors in relation to this matter, which resulted in them withdrawing from the contract offer prior to the start date for delivery of April 1st.

To ensure businesses in Mid Wales are not disadvantaged, we have extended the General Support for Business advisory service to ensure that businesses in the region continue to receive business advice and support.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Further to his reply to WAQ53908, will the Minister advise which of the casualties detailed were pedestrians? (WAQ53976)

The Deputy First Minister: Of the 15 casualties detailed in the reply to WAQ53908, none were pedestrians.

Alun Cairns (South Wales West): Would the Minister (a) make a statement on the Welsh Assembly Government's strategy to develop ICT in Wales; (b) detail which sectors of IT have been prioritised and (c) set out what involvement has been sought from the private sector? (WAQ53989)

The Deputy First Minister: In January 2009 a Ministerial Task and Finish Group was convened to explore issues around ICT. Through discussion, Ministers concluded that it would be appropriate to consider the development of an Information and Communications (ICT) Strategy for Wales. Next steps are now being considered.

The likely scope of the ICT Strategy for Wales will cover ICT in its broadest sense including digital content, the use of public sector information and improving public services through better use of ICT, citizen access and take-up of ICT and all aspects of digital inclusion. It will also recognise that ICT is an enabler, and one of a number which support Assembly Government economic and social policies. The ICT Strategy for Wales will complement existing industry sector strategies.

The Department for the Economy and Transport has a key role to play in the development of the ICT Strategy for Wales, given its responsibility for infrastructure, ICT sector development, creative industries, ICT adoption by business, inward investment, international relations, R&D and innovation, e-security.

The development of an ICT Strategy for Wales is, however, at a very early stage and the mechanisms for engaging with stakeholders have yet to be established.

From an industry perspective, an Industry Sector Strategy team has been established and a sector coordinator appointed from within DE&T.

Working closely with all departments of the Assembly as well as industry-led Fora (notably the Welsh Electronics Forum) the remit of the team will be to develop and deliver a comprehensive 'Route Map' underpinned by detailed action plans for supporting the existing industry base in Wales in areas such as skills, funding, infrastructure, technology, supply chain development etc.

In addition the team works closely with colleagues in IBW to identify opportunities for adding to the 'stock' of ICT companies through inward investment from a range of ICT related sectors globally including Electronics, Software and Financial and Business Services.

Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire): Will the Minister consider extending the use of concessionary passes on the Heart of Wales line to allow holders to use the line for free throughout the year? (WAQ54002)

The Deputy First Minister: The full evaluation of the second year of the concessionary fares rail pilot scheme is nearing completion. The evaluation includes consideration of the Heart of Wales Line. I expect to make an announcement in the near future regarding the continuation of the scheme.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): What monies has the Welsh Assembly Government offered or made available for the redevelopment of Aberystwyth, and what constraints are there on the use of such monies? (WAQ54007)

The Deputy Minister for Regeneration (Leighton Andrews): Funding has been made available to deliver some of the aspirations identified in the Aberystwyth Masterplan and to support significant capital investments in the town such as the £30.5m extension to Bronglais Hospital and the creation of the £55m Institute of Biological, Environmental and Rural Sciences.

We are currently pursuing the creation of a 35 acre strategic employment site for north Ceredigion. Capel Bangor has been identified and planning permission is currently being sought. The total cost to date on the overall project is circa £250,000.

A Town Improvement Grant programme was launched last year and a number of applications have been made by property owners within the town. Funding has been made available for environmental and public realm schemes, of which improvements were made to the harbour garages last year. These monies are available for businesses or property owners and discussions are ongoing with Ceredigion County Council and Aberystwyth Town Council on developing further appropriate schemes. Each project will be subject to a full project appraisal and financial due diligence.

My Officials have had meetings with the developer of the Post Office site in Aberystwyth and have indicated a willingness to support a scheme that strengthens the vitality and viability of the town centre. The developer is currently reviewing his options and is preparing a proposal that considers the views and wishes of local residents.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Why does the Welsh Assembly Government's policy of 20mph speed limit near school and safe routes to school not apply to independent schools? (WAQ54011)

The Deputy First Minister: Welsh Assembly Government policy on 20mph speed limits and safe routes projects does apply to independent schools.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Will the Minister consider introducing 20mph speed limits near recreation grounds and other areas frequented by young people? (WAQ54012)

The Deputy First Minister: The setting of appropriate speed limits, such as 20mph limits, is the responsibility of the local highway authority having regard to pedestrians, junctions, traffic flow and environment. I will shortly be considering new WAG guidelines to assist local authorities in the speed limit selection process. A Road Safety Grant of between £7m to £8m is presently distributed to the local authorities to encourage the use of 20mph zones in suitable areas, which may contain recreation grounds and schools.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Will the Minister provide an update on the possible provision of new railway stations at Bow Street and Llandre? (WAQ54014)

The Deputy First Minister: These do not feature within my Rail Forward Programme. It would therefore be for TraCC to prioritise and include within their Regional Transport Plan.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Will the Minister provide an update on the reopening of Carno Station? (WAQ54015)

The Deputy First Minister: This does not feature within my Rail Forward Programme. It would therefore be for TraCC to prioritise and include within their Regional Transport Plan.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): How many projects are funded by European Structural Funds and what are they? (WAQ54033)

The Deputy First Minister: Under the 2007-2013 Convergence and Regional Competitiveness and Employment programmes in Wales, we have committed £685 million of European funding (35% of total

EU grant) to 87 projects, representing a total investment of over £1.4 billion across Wales.

Mick Bates (Montgomeryshire): Has the Welsh Government approved the TraCC bid for support for preparatory works in 2009/10 submitted in December, which included a proposed rail study of the Cambrian Line which would assess options for new stations such as Carno? (WAQ54047)

The Deputy First Minister: I have not yet agreed the capital funding for TraCC's Regional Transport Plan preparatory works in 2009/10. I am currently considering the final allocation of this fund.

Questions to the Minister for Children, Education, Lifelong Learning and Skills

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): What is the estimated time it will take to recruit the 30 additional careers advisers as announced in the communiqué following the fifth economic summit on 7 April? (WAQ53953)

The Deputy Minister for Skills (John Griffiths): Recruitment of staff will always depend upon local availability of suitable candidates. However, I am sure that all Careers Wales companies will afford the recruitment process their highest priority.

Paul Davies (Preseli Pembrokeshire): How many people are employed by Local Education Authorities in Wales? (WAQ53993)

The Minister for Children, Education, Lifelong Learning and Skills (Jane Hutt): This information is not held centrally

Paul Davies (Preseli Pembrokeshire): How many schools have been built in Wales in the last 10 years? (WAQ54000)

Jane Hutt: Since 2002-03 up to 2008-09 there have been over 107 capital projects providing new schools, significant extensions or substantial refurbishment.

This does not account for projects funded through a local authority's own capital programme, or where schools have been established in existing buildings.

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Will the Minister provide a breakdown, school by school, of the uptake of school breakfasts? (WAQ54009)

Jane Hutt: From January this year, data on schools and pupils who participate in the initiative will be collected through the Pupil Level Annual School Census (PLASC); this information will be published in Summer 2009. Prior to this, data on take-up was collected and submitted by local authorities on a termly basis. The final termly exercise took place in October 2008 and a summary of take-up by pupils at local authority level is published on our website. Take up by pupils at school level for this period is provided in the attached table.

Questions to the Minister for Finance and Public Service Delivery

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): Of the £23m in capital expenditure brought forward in the communiqué of the third economic summit in December 2008, how much was actually spent and on what? (WAQ53962)

The Minister for Finance and Public Service Delivery (Andrew Davies): The £23 million of capital expenditure brought forward from 2010/11 into 2008/09 was for investment in:

- Improvements in the fabric of school, college and university buildings (£9million);
- Acceleration of Social Housing Grant to enable the construction and purchase of affordable homes (£10 million);
- Physical adaptations in the homes of vulnerable people (£2 million); and,
- Accelerating the Heads of the Valleys Low Carbon Building Programme (£2 million).

I will write to you when the final outturn spend on these projects is available, following the completion of the 2008/09 Annual Accounts.

Questions to the Minister for Health and Social Services

Sandy Mewies (Delyn): Are medicines prescribed for chronic respiratory conditions by GPs and multidisciplinary teams being reviewed and monitored within national guidelines? (WAQ54058)

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Edwina Hart): The Welsh Assembly Government has recently undertaken a review of progress against the key actions set out in the Service Development and Commissioning Directives for Chronic Respiratory Conditions. The report showed that 17 out of the 22 LHBs are ensuring that regular monitoring and reviews of all medicines prescribed for chronic respiratory conditions are undertaken. I have written to each of the LHBs and expect to see full compliance when I repeat the audit in September 2009.

Lynne Neagle (Torfaen): Will the Minister provide a list of the neonatal; beds/cots available by hospital in Wales? (WAQ54063)

Edwina Hart: The distribution of cots was published as part of the 2005 Neonatology Review undertaken by Health Commission Wales. This is available on the Welsh Assembly Government website. Current data is not available, but will be collected as part of work in hand to establish Neonatal Networks.

Lynne Neagle (Torfaen): What steps has the Minister been taking to ensure that babies in need of neonatal care are treated at the hospital of their birth? (WAQ54064)

Edwina Hart: It is usual practice for transfer to take place in-utero when it is expected that specialised neonatal care will be needed for babies. However, this is not always possible and it is vital to ensure that babies receive their care in the most appropriate setting. As part of the ongoing work on neonatal services, I tasked Jean Matthes, a senior Neonatologist to chair a working group on Neonatal Transport which will facilitate this. I have also made provisions for work on the establishment of neonatal networks which will ensure the service works together to provide the best standard of care for babies across Wales.

Questions to the Minister for Heritage

Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire): Will the Minister outline the action he is taking to attract major sporting events to Wales? (WAQ54077)

The Minister for Heritage (Alun Ffred Jones): The Welsh Assembly Government is currently investing around £6 million per year in major sporting events that help to raise Wales' profile on the world stage. Events such as the 2009 Ashes Test and the Ryder Cup in 2010 will also help to develop Wales' future capacity and attractiveness to host world class events.

The Welsh Assembly Government leads a Team Wales approach to attracting and hosting major events, working collaboratively with a range of public sector partners and event owners. The IRB Junior World Championship in 2008 was a good example of this. Others include a successful joint bid with Cardiff, Newport and Swansea for the 2009 UK School Games.

To strengthen Wales' position as a premier events destination we have established a new major events unit, reporting to the Deputy First Minister, which is developing a more strategic approach to supporting major events in line with our One Wales agenda. The focus of this work is the development of a portfolio of events that deliver a sustainable economic, social and cultural legacy for the people of Wales.

Questions to the Minister for Rural Affairs

Nick Bourne (Mid and West Wales): When does the Minister expect to put her proposals for badger culling out to public consultation? (WAQ54033)

The Minister for Rural Affairs (Elin Jones): A public Consultation on the Tuberculosis Eradication (Wales) Order 2009 under the Animal Health Act 1981 was released on Friday 24 April 2009. The closing date for responses is Friday 17 July 2009.

Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire): Will the Minister make a statement on the Welsh Assembly Government's support for upland farming in Wales? (WAQ54051)

Elin Jones: 80% of the agricultural land area in Wales is designated as Less Favoured Area and hill and upland issues and impacts are therefore significant in shaping all agricultural policy. The Upland Forum is a ministerial advisory group of farmers and industry leads which offers me policy advice. The Tir Mynydd scheme currently provides specific support for farmers in the hills and uplands of Wales. The Rural Development Plan includes annual baseline provision for Tir Mynydd at £25 million per annum. The Rural Development Plan 2007-2013 for Wales comprises a total support package of £795m including £600m of Welsh Assembly Government money. Approximately 80% of the budget will be directed at Axis 2 the agri-environment agenda and farmers will be the main beneficiaries. Axis 1 includes the Farming Connect service, Processing and Marketing Grants and Supply Chain Efficiency support which is available to upland and lowland farmers while diversification support is available through Axis 3 and 4.

Axis 2

As announced in Plenary on the 5 May 2009, a new agri-environment scheme, Glastir, will replace the current schemes from 2012, which will address the new challenges identified in the CAP Health Check (improving water management, taking action against the worst effects of Climate Change, enhancing biodiversity and addressing the need for bio-energy) and deliver more clearly defined environmental outcomes in return for scheme payment. Whilst there will no longer be a dedicated measure for the Less Favoured Area, there will be a 20% premium for all LFA farmers entering the all-Wales element of Glastir.

Kirsty Williams (Brecon and Radnorshire): Will the Minister make a statement on the setting up and progress of the Intensive Action Pilot Area (IAPA) to curb the spread of TB in cattle and badgers? (WAQ54052)

Elin Jones: Last week the consultation on the proposed Tuberculosis Eradication (Wales) Order 2009 under the Animal Health Act 1981 started. The proposed Order will allow the Welsh Assembly Government to assume responsibility for managing a badger cull and gain powers of entry for the purposes of vaccinating badgers in the future.

Officials have met with farmers and vets in north Pembrokeshire to start to identify appropriate cattle controls for the IAPA. In line with my commitment to Assembly Members, the evidence and information

presented to me will be published on the Welsh Assembly Government website this week. This includes a table of suggested cattle measures in the IAPA.

The Intensive Action Pilot Area is one element of our comprehensive programme to eradicate TB and we are continuing to push through other initiatives and policies across Wales.
