Edwina Hart: Businesses should consider a number of different sources for their business finance in order to find the most suitable for their particular circumstances. There are many different types of finance available that go beyond that traditionally provided by the high street banks, Funding Circle is one of them.

In January, I launched an independent review into the availability of private sector funding for SMEs in Wales, led by Professor Dylan Jones-Evans. The review is considering the merits of alternative sources of funding, including the opportunities afforded by peer-to-peer lenders like Funding Circle. His report and policy recommendations are due in the autumn of 2013.

The Minister for Finance (Jane Hutt): The last expenditure analysis commissioned shows that Walesbased suppliers are winning a larger share of the £4.3bn public sector expenditure, increasing from 35% in 2004 to 52% in 2010/11.

Currently we cannot report on the number of contracts awarded to Welsh companies but once the new sell2wales platform has gone live in June this data will start to become available.

Manual monitoring of construction award notices shows that two-thirds of framework places or direct contract awards have gone to businesses whose head-quarters is in Wales.

Use of the community benefits approach has increased the opportunities available through the supply chain and the first 18 projects to report showed that 82% was retained in Wales through direct salaries and supply chain expenditure.

The Wales Procurement Policy Statement that I announced in December provides the nine principles against which I expect public procurement to be carried out. Adoption of this policy in full will provide Wales based businesses with opportunities to win contracts and I will be closely monitoring its adoption.

Jane Hutt: The Wales Procurement Policy Statement, which I announced in December, contains the nine principles against which I expect public procurement in Wales to be carried out. One of these principles concerns 'open and accessible competition' and states that 'public bodies should adopt risk based, proportionate approaches to procurement to ensure that contract opportunities are open to all and smaller, local suppliers are not precluded from winning contracts individually, as consortia, or through roles within the supply chain'.

I have made clear that I expect public bodies to adopt risk based, proportionate approaches to procurement, ensuring that appropriate lotting strategies are used, contracts are advertised widely and the SQuID (Supplier Qualification Information Database) approach is taken to pre-qualification.

Where Welsh Government co-ordinate demand and establish collaborative contracts or frameworks, these are developed using intelligent procurement approaches – aggregation of demand does not necessarily mean aggregation of supply. Value Wales' Framework Agreement Guidance encourages use of lotting, to break contracts into more manageable chunks for smaller suppliers.

The Lessons Learned review into frameworks that I published in February 2012 concluded that collaborative frameworks can be effective if best practice is followed, and in particular where the requirement is split into lots to make it easier for smaller firms to bid. My officials have been working with Denbighshire Council, lead authority for the 21st Century Schools programme, to ensure this approach is adopted. Over the last two years, two-thirds of all major construction contracts and framework awards have been won by businesses with their head-quarters in Wales.

However the Royal Mencap Society hold a contract with the Department of Health to provide a whistleblowing helpline that covers NHS and social care employees and employers across England and Wales. The contract has been in place since the 1st January 2012.

The helpline is to support staff who are unsure what to do when they have concerns. Advisors are available to guide staff to their respective organisations internal processes and where to seek legal, trade union or other representation. Advice is also provided on legal rights to protection under the Public Interest Disclosure Act and how staff could present their case to their organisation.

The Royal Mencap Society will have no actual role in taking concerns forward on behalf of staff,or investigating concerns.

The Welsh Government has previously instructed NHS organisations to ensure that Whistleblowing policies are in place to enable staff to raise concerns internally.

The Minister for Natural Resources and Food (Alun Davies): Research on Flood Advocacy and Support Services for Communities in Wales was launched at the Wales Flood Summit on 4 March 2013 with its findings simultaneously published on the Welsh Government website.

Officials are undertaking further work on a Flood Support Framework as recommended in the research report and investigating cost and resource implications of a Flood Support Service for Wales, popularly referred to as a flood forum.
