Amendments tabled on 10 June 2002

To propose that the Assembly resolve to adopt the following amendments to motions:

1. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add at end of Point 3:

', recognising that carers make enormous savings to the public purse and therefore require a commitment to secure long term funding.'

2. Jocelyn Davies (South Wales East)

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Calls on the Government to ensure that the Strategy for Carers is integral with other Assembly Strategies and policies.'

3. Jonathan Morgan (South Wales Central)

Add as new point at end of motion:

'Welcomes the acceptance in principle by the Welsh Assembly Government that data on the number of Carers Assessments should be collected on an annual basis.'
