Dear Mr Miller,

On Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2012 you were provided with a response to your Written Assembly Question asking how many incidents of violence towards staff from pupils were recorded over the past 5 years and, of those incidents, how many involved the use of a knife, and how many involved the use of any other weapon (WAQ59662). The response consisted of a table of the number of exclusions of pupils due to assault or violence against staff by local authority for academic years 2006/07 to 2010/11.

I am writing to inform you that since the data were published in the South Wales Echo and the Evening Post, Swansea local authority have revised their exclusions data, meaning that their data for 2010/11 in the table that you were given is no longer correct. For reference I have included the amended table below and I apologise for any inconvenience this may have caused.

\* means that the data item is disclosive. This symbol is used to cover numbers betw een 1 and 4 to prevent the disclosure of sensitive information. In the event that the covered data items could be identified by subtraction from the Wales total at least one extra data item is covered to prevent this from happening.
