Lesley Griffiths: The table below sets out the additional central palliative and end of life care funding offered by the Welsh Government to hospices, to deliver objectives set annually as part of their 3 year Funding Agreements, for the financial year 2012-2013.

This funding is based on a robust formula developed by the Palliative Care Implementation Board (PCIB) to fund hospices for the clinical consultant led services provided on behalf of the NHS. Progress against the annual funding objectives is reviewed by the PCIB to help inform its advice to the Welsh Government on the level and use of actual funding for each subsequent financial year.

Funding other than set out below is provided directly from Local Health Boards to fund consultant posts, specialised nursing posts and data entry administrative posts. Additional funding is also provided by a number of charitable organisations.

The Welsh Government also provides funding to certain hospices to cover the additional staff costs following the increase in the NHS Pension employers contributions in 2004. The amounts for each hospice for 2012-2013 are as follows:

Lesley Griffiths: A staged approach has been developed to ensure delivery of this key Government commitment. The first phase focuses on ensuring the appropriate distribution of appointments during contracted core hours to better meet the needs of patients. For working people, this relates to ensuring more appointments towards the latter part of the day from 5:00pm to 6:30pm and reducing half day or lunchtime closing. This is the priority for 2012/13 and good progress has been made to-date. There are no additional cost implications associated with redistributing appointments during contracted core hours and reducing half day or lunchtime closing.

The second phase, from 2013/14, will focus on ensuring the availability of appointments outside contracted hours i.e. after 6.30pm. The intention will be to fund the additional cost of this extended access within existing resources, by reviewing and realigning the current spend on enhanced services. Based on the current specification and allowing for a rise in inflation, the estimated costs for increasing the number of practices offering the extended opening DES (on one or two evenings a week) to 30% of practices in 2013/14 and 50% in 2015/16 are £1.8m and £3.1m respectively. A review is currently underway to assess whether the provision of the existing extended opening enhanced service meets patients' needs and delivers value for money. The findings of this review will be used to inform the approach for extending opening after 6.30pm during the week. The work is being led by Health Boards, working with GPC Wales and the review will be completed by the end of December 2012.

The third phase focuses on access and availability of services on the weekend. Work has been commissioned to develop an innovative model for access to planned appointments on a locality basis. Some initial proposals have been identified within the interim report on "Out of Hours Services",

however further work needs to be undertaken and a sub-group of the National Urgent and Emergency Care Board is being established to take this work forward. This will be used to identify the model for access to services on the weekend and will also highlight any resource implications. However, it is the intention to manage any cost implications from within existing resources.

Lesley Griffiths: There are occasions where it will be necessary to treat patients in the independent sector, whether it is because of a shortage of specialist services, such as mental health, where the service is not provided by the NHS, or because of a lack of available capacity. Health Boards have been advised they should look initially at utilising available capacity in the NHS in Wales, then England, and use the private / independent sector as a last resort.

With regard to the number and percentage of procedures carried out in private hospitals for each of the last three years, this information is contained in the table below.

Lesley Griffiths: This information is held by Health Boards and the Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee (WHSSC) but it is generally not possible for them to release the information because of the need to protect patient confidentiality.

At an All-Wales level, Public Health Wales (PHW) collates data from Health Boards. This aggregated data can be published without the risk of breaking patient confidentiality. A regular publication process is being developed by PHW and their report for 2012-13 will be published in May 2013.

PHW has provided management information data for the first 6 months of the current calendar year. This shows Health Boards received 323 applications for medicines through the Individual Patient Funding Request (IPFR) route. A total of 148 were approved. PHW has supplied a list of cancer medicines which were made available through the IPFR route for the period requested and these are presented at Annex 1.

The PHW information does not include applications made to WHSSC.
