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SUMMARY OF THE WORK OF THE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE 2006-2007

PREFACE BY THE CHAIR OF THE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE

The Legislation Committee first met on 14 September 1999. The first Chair of the Committee, Michael German AM, informed the Members that the Committee reports would be laid before the Assembly and attached to the relevant draft Order for consideration by the relevant plenary session. The reports would be drawn to the attention of Assembly Members when papers for plenary sessions were circulated. This procedure formed the basis of the Committee's work throughout all these years.

The first item of draft Assembly legislation considered by the Committee was "The Local Government Act 1999 (Commencement) (Wales) Order 1999" (report LC1) and the last Statutory Instrument was "The Local Authorities (Allowances for Members) (Wales) Regulations 2007" (report LC1513) considered at the last meeting on the 20 March 2007. In total the Committee has considered 1513 pieces of legislation.

The Committee has met weekly during the First and Second Assemblies and has published a total of eight Annual reports.

In July 2001 the then Chair of the Legislation Committee, Mick Bates AM, attended an International Conference on Regulation Reform Management and Scrutiny of Legislation held at the New South Wales State Parliament in Sydney, Australia and made a presentation entitled "Regulatory Reform – a Welsh Perspective". The Committee later published his report.

In 2002 the Committee made a written submission to the Richard Commission. The Chair of the Committee Mick Bates represented the Committee before the Commission.

In July 2005 the Committee forwarded its views to the Assembly's White Paper Committee; the document was entitled "The scrutiny of legislation following the 2007 elections to the National Assembly". The Committee's Chair Glyn Davies AM attended the White Paper Committee to put forward the committee's representations.

In spring 2006 the Legislation Committee considered the potential remit of a subordinate legislation committee established by the Third Assembly following the coming into force of the Government of Wales Act 2006. The Committee has received a number of written

representations and heard the evidence of many experts and related organisations. The Committee particularly appreciated the contributions of Sylvia Jackson MSP, Stewart Maxwell MSP of the Subordinate Legislation Committee of the Scottish Parliament; the Chair of the Assembly's Business Committee Jenny Randerson AM, David Lambert and Marie Navarro of Cardiff Law School, Anna Daniel of the Members' Research Service in Brussels. Details of the papers and discussions can be accessed on the Committee's internet page. The Report of the Review was submitted to the First Minister, the Presiding Officer and all Assembly Members and published on the Committee's website.

This very necessary and meticulous scrutiny would be impossible without the contribution of the Committee Members.

PROCEDURES BY WHICH LEGISLATION IS MADE

The National Assembly processes legislation in four different ways: by Standard Procedure, Executive Procedure, Accelerated Procedure or Extended Procedure. The Legislation Committee also scrutinises legislation made under Standing Order (SO)25.2 and SO29.

Standard Procedure

Under the Standard Procedure, the responsible Minister publishes a draft order to all members and invites comments on whether it should be considered by a subject committee. Normally the Minister also carries out a regulatory appraisal of the likely costs and benefits of the draft order. The Minister then submits the draft order to the Business Committee and recommends whether it should be referred to a subject committee. Following Business Committee consideration, the Deputy Presiding Officer decides whether the draft order should be referred to a subject committee (extended procedure) and, after any report by the subject committee, the Minister tables the draft order in Plenary and refers it to the Legislation Committee. The Legislation Committee then reports on whether the Assembly should pay special attention to the draft order. After being approved by the Assembly, the order may be made (SO 24).

Extended Procedure

The extended procedure is when a draft order is sent to a subject committee by the Deputy Presiding Officer as outlined within the description of the Standard Procedure above (SO 24.6 – 24.8).

Accelerated Procedure

The Accelerated Procedure is when, on motion of the Minister, the Assembly votes to approve a draft Order without any debate (SO 24.25), but after it has completed all other stages of the Standard Procedure.

Executive Procedure

Under the Executive Procedure, the Assembly Cabinet may determine that it is not reasonably practical to comply with one or more of the standard procedure stages, including seeking approval from the Assembly. Where an Order has been made without consideration by the Assembly a Member may within 40 working days of the Order being made table a motion that the Order be revoked. If the Order has not been considered by the Legislation Committee before being made, it is referred to the Committee subsequently. Any defects noted under Standing Order 11.7 should normally be rectified the next time the National Assembly legislates on the subject. However, if the defect is particularly serious, it is recommended that amending legislation should be made to rectify the matter as soon as possible.

Standing Order 29 Legislation

The Legislation Committee also considers SO29 legislation. This subordinate legislation is not required to be made by Statutory Instrument and is not subject to parliamentary procedure.

Standing Order 25.2 Legislation

Subordinate legislation subject to a relevant Parliamentary procedure.

SECOND ASSEMBLY: FOURTH YEAR ANALYSIS

INTRODUCTION

The role of the Legislation Committee is to scrutinise relevant Assembly subordinate legislation to ensure that it is within the scope of enabling powers and is properly drafted. Its statutory basis is set out in sections 58 and 59 of the Government of Wales Act 1998 and its functions are detailed in Standing Order 11.

This is the Fourth Annual Report of the work of the Legislation Committee (Second Assembly) covering the period July 2006 - March 2007. During that time the Committee considered a total of **171** pieces of subordinate legislation.

This annual report provides an overview of the Committee's scrutiny of Statutory Instruments. The results are presented in the form of a summary table for ease of reference.

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES: STANDING ORDER 11.7

Standing Order 11.7 sets out grounds on which the Committee is to invite the National Assembly to pay special attention to legislation. The grounds are as follows:

- doubt as to whether the legislation is within the Assembly's powers or appears to make unusual or unexpected use of the powers under which it is made;
- it is excluded from challenge in the courts;
- it appears to have unauthorised retrospective effect;
- its form or meaning needs further explanation;
- its drafting appears to be defective or fails to fulfil statutory or other legal requirements;
- there appear to be inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts
- the subordinate legislation uses gender specific language;
- the subordinate legislation is not to be made in both English and Welsh.

Before reporting to the Assembly the Committee is, under Standing Order 11.6, required to notify the relevant Assembly Minister of this intention and invite him or her to give evidence to the Committee.

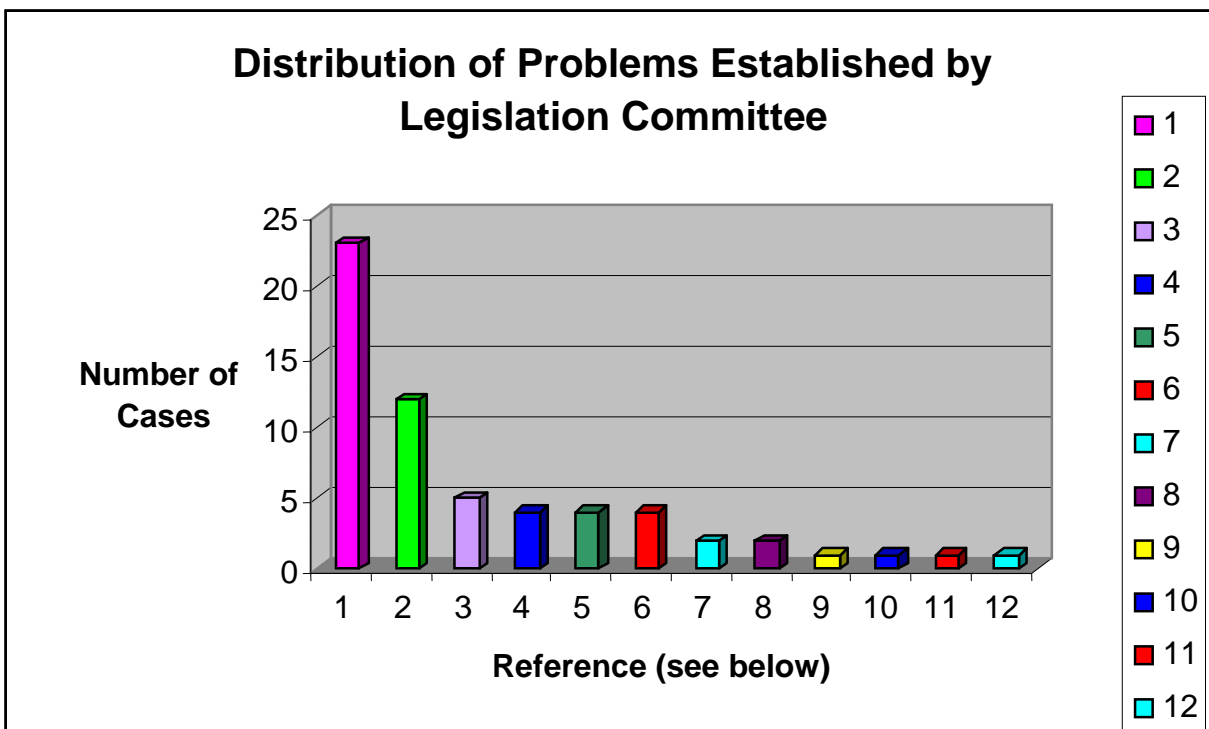
During the reporting period (July 2006 – March 2007) the Committee considered **171** pieces of legislation.

The Committee invited the Assembly to pay special attention to legislation on **60** separate occasions. In the majority of cases those defects were capable of correction by Memorandum of Correction: **47** out of total **60** occasions.

The reasons why the Committee invited the Assembly to pay special attention to Statutory Instruments were as follows:

- the drafting appeared to be defective - **23** cases;

- defective drafting, there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **12** cases;
- subordinate legislation is not to be made in both English and Welsh – **5** cases;
- defective drafting, subordinate legislation is not to be made in both English and Welsh – **4** cases;
- defective drafting, subordinate legislation is not to be made in both English and Welsh, subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **4** cases;
- defective drafting, inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts, subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **4**;
- there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **2** cases;
- defective drafting, subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **2** cases;
- subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **1** case;
- defective drafting, form or meaning needs further explanation – **1** case;
- defective drafting, there is doubt whether the subordinate legislation is within the Assembly’s powers – **1**;
- defective drafting, form or meaning needs further explanation, there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **1** case.



- 1** - defective drafting - **23** cases;
- 2** - defective drafting, there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **12** cases;
- 3** - subordinate legislation is not to be made in both English and Welsh – **5** cases;

- 7** - there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **2** cases;
- 8** - defective drafting, subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **2** cases;
- 9** - subordinate legislation uses gender specific language – **1** case;
- 10** - defective drafting, form or meaning needs further explanation – **1** case;
- 11** - defective drafting, there is doubt whether the subordinate legislation is within the Assembly's powers – **1**;
- 12** - defective drafting, form or meaning needs further explanation, there were inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts - **1** case.

Out of a total of **171** Statutory Instruments considered during the period from July 2006 to March 2007, the Committee did not need to make any comments under S.O.11.7 in respect of **111** Orders. The Committee invited the Assembly to pay special attention to legislation on **60** separate occasions. Of these, **17** are available as printed versions at present. **9** final versions took into account Committee suggestions fully; **2** final versions incorporated some of the suggestions; **4** final versions did not incorporate the suggestions; **2** final versions had the points taken into consideration, amendments intended in the new Sis.

In many instances the legal advisers to the Committee had been asked to comment on early drafts of legislation. This resulted in a considerable number of drafting and other points being corrected prior to formal submission of the legislation to the Committee.

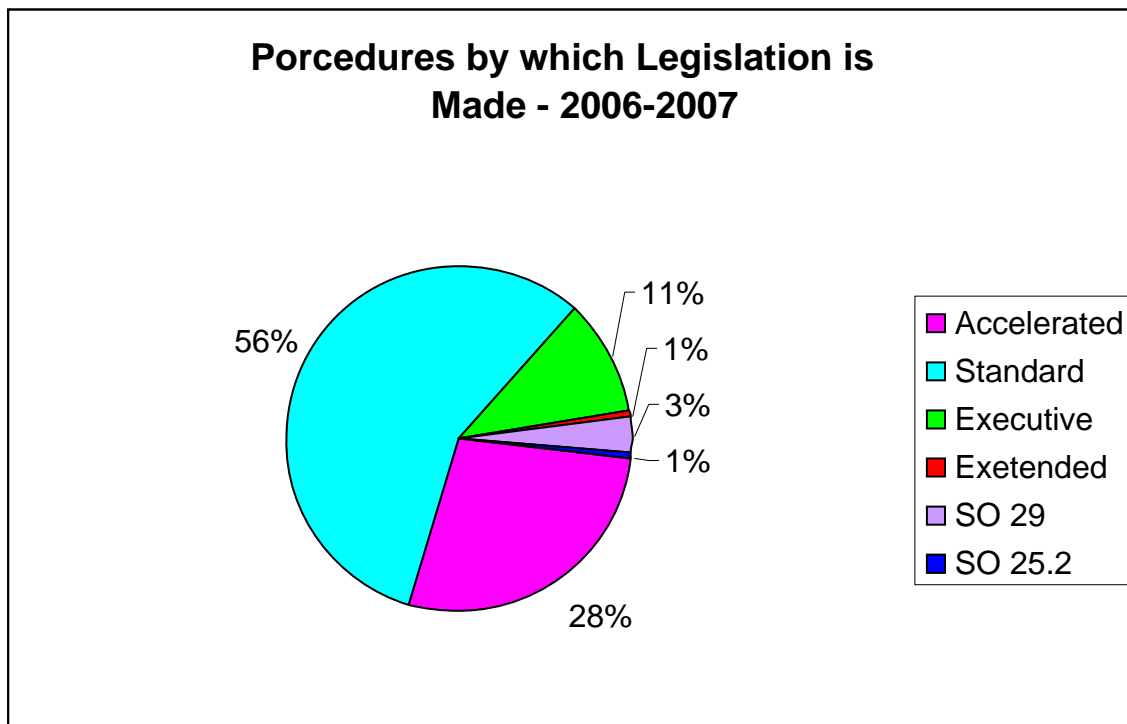
OBSERVATIONS

Besides reporting formally under Standing Order 11.7, the Committee's reports to the Assembly have included observations on minor defects.

In total, the Committee made **66** observations. Of these, the Committee pointed out cases where drafting was defective on **33** occasions and made suggestions on the need for greater clarity on **6** occasions. Typographical errors were found in **16** cases. **6** cases contained grammatical errors. Minor inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts were established in **5** cases.

PROCEDURES BY WHICH LEGISLATION IS MADE: 2006-2007

The National Assembly processes legislation in five different ways: by Standard Procedure, Executive Procedure, Accelerated Procedure, S.O.29 and S.O.25 Part II. Out of total **171** Orders considered by the Committee during the period from July 2004 to July 2005, **102** cases (60.0%) followed the Standard Procedure; **19** cases (11.1%) - the Executive Procedure; **49** cases (29%) - the Accelerated Procedure, **1** case (0.6%) followed the Extended Procedure. Out of 102 cases that followed the Standard Procedure, **6** cases (3.5% of the total 171 SIs) – Standing Order 29 and **1** case (0.6% of the total 171 SIs) – Standing Order 25 Part II.



OPERATIONAL MATTERS

The Legislation Committee met every week when the Assembly was in session and therefore it had to work to very tight deadlines. However, the Committee operated smoothly. All draft Statutory Instruments and legal adviser reports were placed on the agenda of meetings held soon after the dates when the draft legislation was laid before the Assembly. The Committee Secretariat aimed to provide Members with all papers two working days before the meeting, in line with the Sanding Order 8.22. Following each meeting the Secretariat ensured that the Committee's Reports were laid before the Assembly as soon as possible, usually the same day. The reports and minutes were placed on the Internet within two working days after the Committee meetings. All SO 11.6 letters (i.e., the letters from the Chair alerting the Minister that the Committee had invited the Assembly to pay special attention to proposed Assembly Orders) were also sent within that time scale.
