The Minister for Education and Skills (Leighton Andrews): All UK higher education institutions are autonomous bodies with responsibility for their own academic and administrative affairs, including their admissions processes. The Welsh Government has no power to intervene in higher education admissions, however, it is important that we ensure that our young people are realising their potential and achieving the qualifications that they need to apply to universities of their choice. I have made it clear that I want to see standards and performance in schools in Wales improve across the board and I have already put in place measures to address underperformance.

The Welsh Government takes seriously its responsibility to Welsh-domiciled students, and we will be preserving the principle that the state should subsidise higher education and maintain opportunities for all. Also central to the Welsh Government's policy is the principle that access to higher education should be on the basis of the individual's potential to benefit, and not on the basis of what they can afford to pay. In Wales we are leading the way in providing support to students to ensure that funding is not a barrier to accessing higher education no matter where students choose to study, in Wales or elsewhere in the UK.

Lesley Griffiths: I launched a medical recruitment campaign on 1 February this year. This campaign is aimed at attracting doctors to Wales by giving a greater profile to the benefit of both living and working in Wales.

To date the campaign has focused on the development of a bilingual website which, for the first time, brings together relevant information for those considering training and working in Wales. This was signposted in articles within the British Medical Journal during February.

In April the First Minister and I met with a range of clinicians at Morriston Hospital to discuss their view on what they see as the benefits and barriers of working in Wales.

We continue to target recruitment fairs and other careers events where we are able to talk about the opportunities in Wales. In particular, Wales recently had a presence at an Emergency Medicine Continuous Professional Development event held in London.

Key stakeholders have also been working together to develop case studies which focus on doctors experiences of working in Wales and the benefit they themselves consider to have been important to them.

A Campaign Reference Group led by Helen Birtwhistle, Director of the Welsh NHS Confederation, has also been established to take forward the different elements of the Campaign and to consider whether additional steps need to be taken. Each Health Board has an individual whose role is to link directly with this group to ensure consistency in approach and that each organisation has an opportunity to contribute ideas.

We are holding a number of events as part of the campaign and the next one will be held on Monday 25 June in the Swalec Stadium, Cardiff to celebrate success.

Derbyniwyd ateb i'w gyhoeddi ar 25 Mai 2012 Answer received for publication on 25 May 2012 **Peter Black:** The Assembly Commission aims to effectively maintain and improve its buildings and facilities for Members and public visitors to ensure they support Assembly business in the most appropriate, effective and efficient way. The Commission also has full repairing and insuring obligations as part of its long term lease interest for Ty Hywel. Accordingly, the Commission proactively reviews its operations at regular intervals and considers any needs and requirements for potential improvements and any refurbishments to facilities within Ty Hywel.

It has been recognised for some time that the current layout and arrangements for the Ty Hywel entrance and reception are far from ideal in relation to the respective positioning of the reception desk and security scanning facilities, nor do they make best use of the available space. The current arrangements do not provide an effective welcoming environment for the 40,000 visitors per annum to Ty Hywel or one which informs and educates visitors about the work of the Assembly. These issues have been raised by new Assembly Members in their discussions with the Presiding Officer. Staff working in these areas have experienced uncomfortable working temperatures due to loss of heat as a result of the height of the atrium and cold air blowing into the building from the frequent usage of the disabled double door entrance. The growing demand for meetings and events space within the Assembly estate has prompted consideration of adapting the area behind reception, to improve the facilities the Assembly can offer.

To address these issues, Assembly staff have discussed the feasibility of adaptations to the Ty Hywel reception and entrance. Initial concept designs are being reviewed by staff to assess their operational benefits. These discussions and considerations are on-going and no recommendations have been made or decisions taken by the Assembly Commission.

As with all other investment and improvement projects implemented by the Assembly, this potential project would be subject to an investment decision process which would consider:

- A business case
- Effective alignment of the project to the Commission's strategic objectives
- Consideration of service interdependencies
- Robust challenge and assessment of the project proposals
- Detailed cost estimates
- Competitive tendering and procurement processes to ensure quality solutions and value for money

The cost of any adaptations would be met from existing budgets set aside for investment in Assembly services and facilities.
