Fod y Cynulliad yn llonyfarch Cymdeithas Owain Lawgoch ar eu hymdrehigion i dynnu sylw at fywyd a gwaith Owain Lawgoch yn y 14eg ganrif, ac yn arbennig y cytundeb o gyfeillgarwch a gyflawnodd rhwng Cymru a Ffrainc; ein bod yn croesawu'r cysylltiadau newydd sydd wedi eu creu gyda chymuned Mortagne-Sur –Gironde ble cafodd Owain ei ladd, a ble y gobeithir dadorchuddio cofeb iddo yn 2003, sef 625 mlynedd wedi ei lofruddio; a chredwn y dylid, o fewn y gyfundrefn o ddysgu hanes Cymru, roddi sylw priodol i gyfraniad Owain tuag at ddatblygu cysylltiadau a chyfandir Ewrop.

That the Assembly congratulates Cymdeithas Owain Lawgoch on its efforts to highlight the work and life of Owain Lawgoch in the 14th century, particularly the compact of allegiance between Wales and France; that we welcome the new links forged with the Mortagne-Sur-Gironde community where Owain was killed, and where it is hoped to unveil a memorial in 2003, 625 years after his murder; and we believe that, within the system of teaching Welsh history, appropriate attention should be given to Owain's contribution to the development of links with the continent of Europe.
